## From Our Pastor:

The teaching of the Church in "Memoriale Domini" is clear. Blessed Paul VI, after having consulted with every bishop in the world and published the results of their votes, said clearly that the Church must not change the traditional way of receiving communion, i.e. kneeling at the rail and on the tongue. He left it in the hands of a few bishops' conferences to handle the schismatic situation already underway in a few dioceses. It is clear in the wording of "Memoriale Domini" that no other bishops' conferences were given authority to decide on this matter. So when Archbishop Bernardin began to cajole the American bishops to vote on this matter in the mid 1970's he is acting outside of his authority and actually disobeying the Pope. Most of the Bishops realized this and stood firm on their "no" vote. Communion in the hand was voted down twice by the Bishops Conference of the USA, so Archbishop Bernardin called a third vote in which he as president of the conference could declare certain votes invalid and this time included votes of some retired bishops who normally weren't allowed to vote and finally got a majority in favor of the prohibited practice. ## HAPPY FEAST OF PENTECOST: THE BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH!!

The solemnity of Pentecost closes the Easter season and celebrates God's gift of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and disciples. Before his passion, Jesus had told his disciples that he would send them another Advocate, the Paraclete, who would instruct them in all things. At the Ascension, Jesus tells them to go back to Jerusalem and await the power that would come upon them. And so, 50 days after the resurrection, on the Jewish feast of Pentecost, the same Holy Spirit which had hovered over the waters of creation, which caused the prophets of the Old Testament to preach, which overshadowed Mary at the Annunciation, which hovered over Jesus at his baptism, which Jesus had breathed upon those gathered in the upper room on Easter night, now comes forth from God to the Apostles like a mighty wind and as tongues of fire. And so the Church is born, and the world is forever changed. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, divine life flows in and through the Apostles out into the world as they teach and heal in the name of Jesus. "New life"... "forgiveness"... "resurrection"... "baptism"... "believe"... these words and more were on the disciples' lips as they went forth from Jerusalem out into Judea and to the ends of the Roman Empire proclaiming Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

The same Holy Spirit which came upon the apostles 2000 years ago is the same Holy Spirit that we have been given and gifted with. It is the same Holy Spirit that descended upon our 17 students that celebrated Confirmation earlier in May. We too have been empowered to continue the work of Jesus as part of the mystical Body of Christ, as part of the Church. Even though today will be the last day that the Easter candle is lit for Sunday Eucharist, and the baptismal water will be silent, we have been gifted and empowered by the Holy Spirit to bring the light of Christ into our homes and community by living each day our baptismal call to holiness.
